

TIME OUT

When you are reading this many people will have come back from summer holidays and I hope you have all had time for some real recreation. All of us need that time out, whether it is getting away on holiday or just taking a cup of tea (or something stronger) into the garden and sitting for 5 minutes.

My favourite place to get away from it all is sitting on a beach. There was a recent survey by the National Trust that made the news: 20% fewer people were visiting our coast than used to. The reasons given were being too busy and overcrowded beaches. The survey also stated that 18-24 year olds are least connected to the coast (although the surfing beaches of Devon and Cornwall may disagree).

My childhood was full of days out by the sea or days nagging my dad to take us there, but I have to admit I spend far less time at the coast now than I would like. It would help if it was a bit nearer.

Now the sea and coastline are not going to fade away from underuse but that doesn't mean it is a shame that people feel they are too busy to visit. The paradox is the busier we get, the more we need to withdraw at some point, catch our breath and refocus, otherwise we are in danger of colluding with the modern disease of being too busy and our working hours becoming a competition.

One of my solutions is my dog Leah. Although often I would rather not go out for a walk she forces me to stop and go out; it's amazing when I let my brain focus on something else how often the answers to the questions that have been troubling me come to the fore. I wonder if you have similar experiences. An old solution for some is the shed or garage, a place to go to get some time out, it's now been reinvented as the man shed (also available as women sheds).

In my experience it is like that when we think about spending time with God. The more we have to do the more we need to make ourselves put some time aside just to be with God.

There is the famous story of Suzanna Wesley who was a busy mum with many children - when she wanted space she sat in her favourite chair and put her apron over her head and the family knew to leave her alone.

We are very fortunate here that people are willing to open our churches each day for a place you can find 5 minutes of peace amidst the chaotic lives many of us lead. So if you are feeling that there is too much to do and too little time to do it, take some time out even if it appears impossible, maybe that is just the break you need to recreate yourself.

Our July meeting began sadly with one minute's silence for a well-loved member, Tony Cox, who had died unexpectedly that week. We send our love to Helen. We also sang "Happy Birthday" to Beryl and Di, and wish them many happy returns.

The talk, "The Magic of Herbs", was given by Bett Partridge, a practising medical herbalist, whose interest in the healing power of plants was sparked at the age of six, as she mooched about after her grandfather, an apothecary (lovely word). Herbs have not only been used for healing, but to make dyes, flavour food, and cleanse the atmosphere. The history is extremely old, records of instruction in preparations existing from 2,000 B.C. The Romans introduced over 200 herbs to Britain and after they left, herbal knowledge lay largely with Christian monks who ran what were, effectively, the first hospitals. Now it is regarded as an unorthodox branch of medicine, but nevertheless the W.H.O. is conducting fieldwork among aboriginal peoples, as much traditional knowledge is being lost with the disappearance of forest habitats. It was an intriguing and strangely soothing talk.


CROSCOMBE WI
